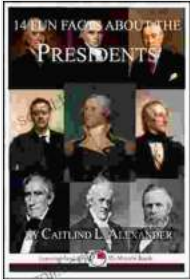
#### **14. John F. Kennedy's Secret Service Codename**

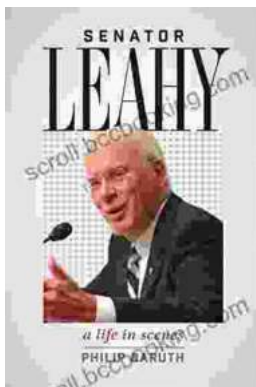
