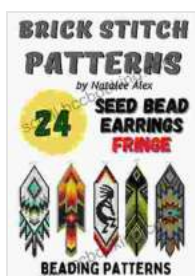

## **Materials You'll Need**

- Size 11 seed beads in your desired colors
- Beading thread (Nymo, FireLine, or S-Lon recommended)
- Beading needle
- Scissors
- Crimp beads

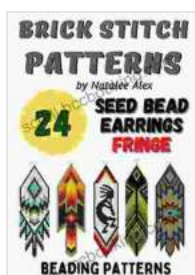
