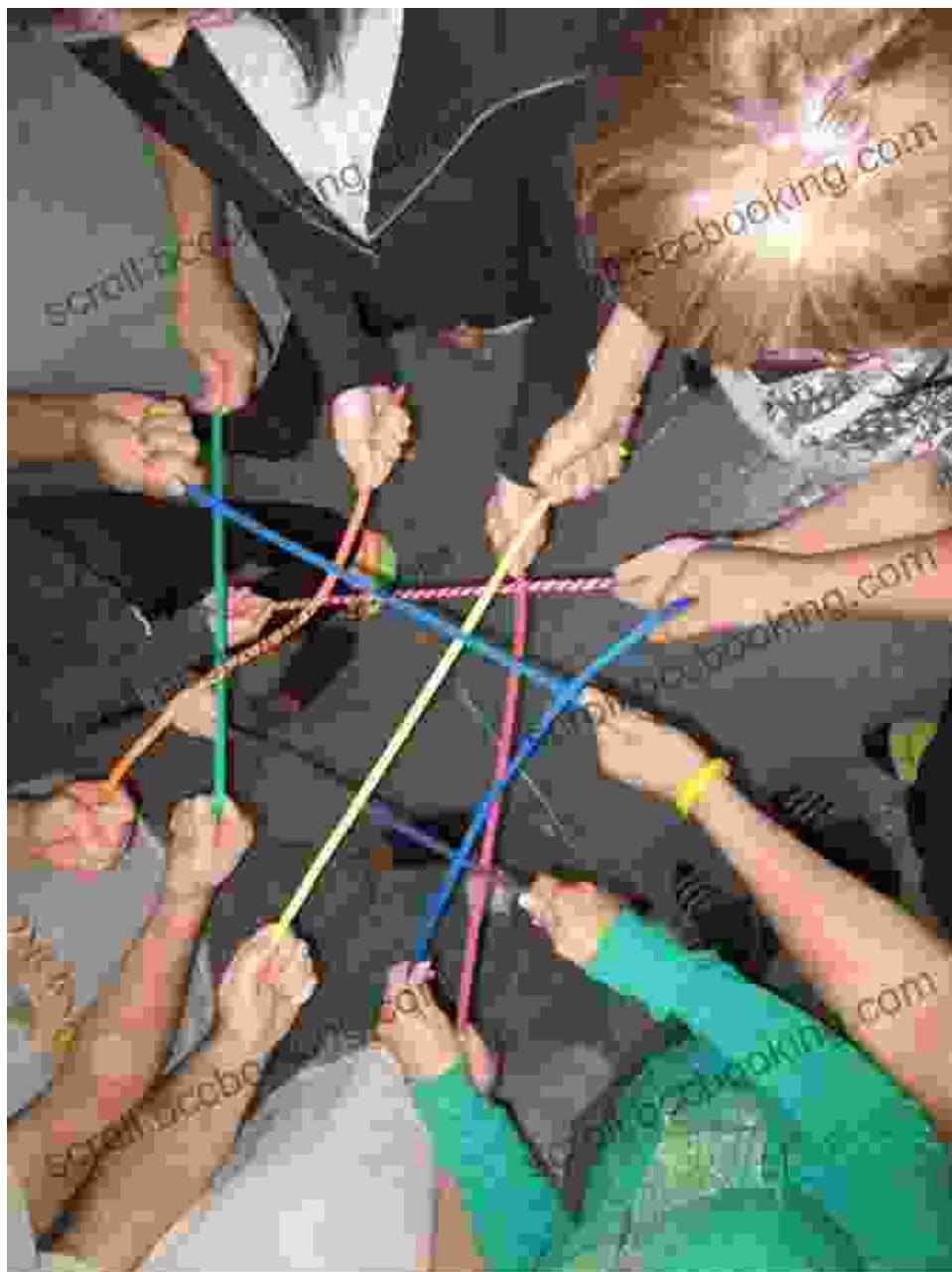
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Team Building Games for Cooperation and Collaboration

6. Scavenger Hunt

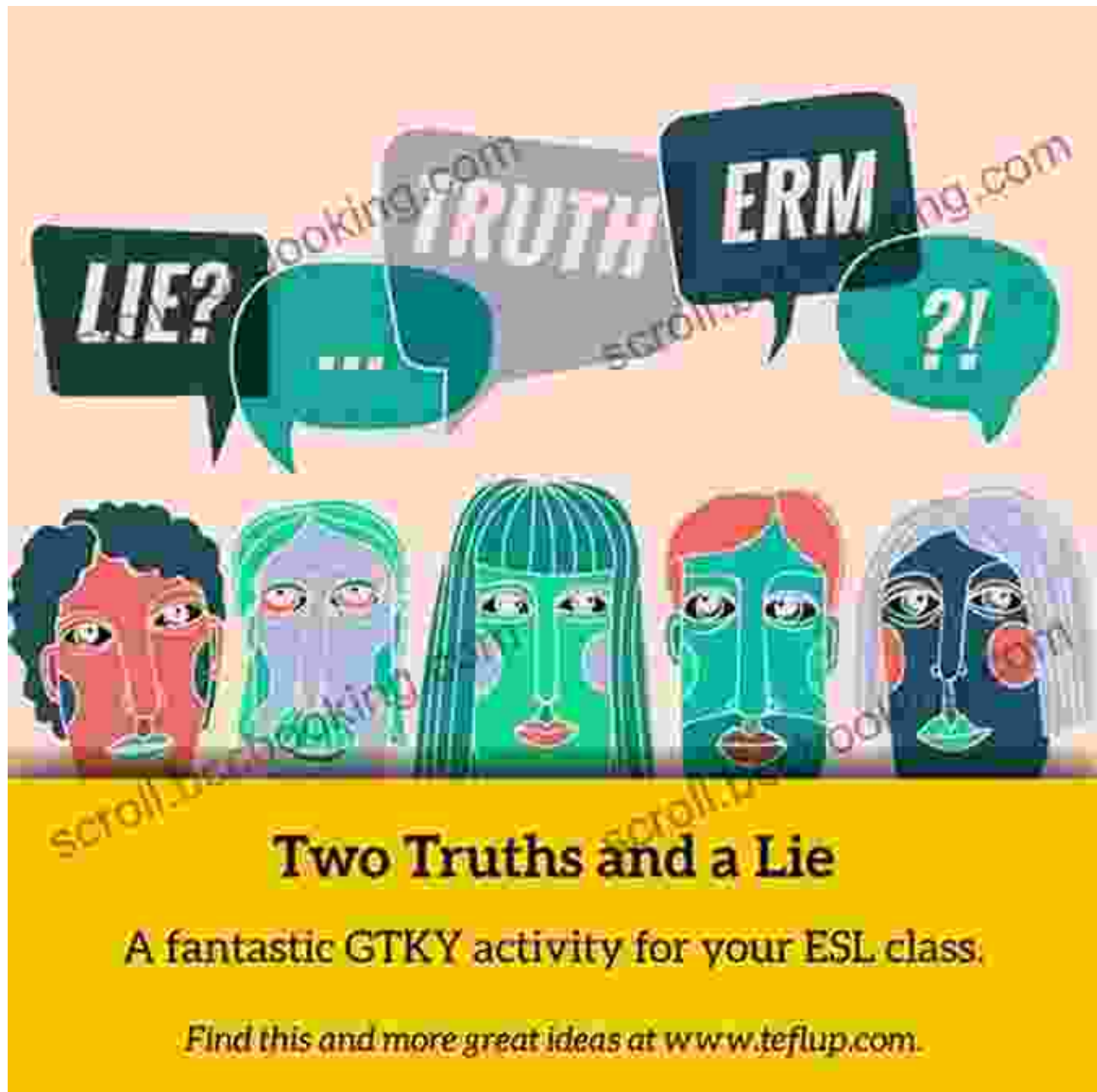

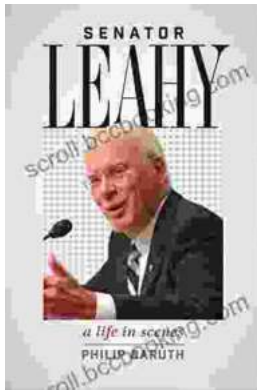
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
